Provide parents with frequent reports on their child's progress.

- *Progress reports will be sent home or posted online every grading period*
- *Report cards will be mailed home at the end of each semester*
- *Parent Portal in Power School can be accessed at any time*

Provide parents reasonable access to staff.

- *Parents may call the school any time to schedule a live or virtual appointment with their child's teacher, counselor, vice principal or school principal*
- *Teachers are available to meet before/after school and during their prep time*
- *Teacher/Staff are available by email*

Provide reasonable access to staff, opportunities for parents and family members to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and to observe classroom activities.

- *Parents may apply with the front office to volunteer in the classroom at any time during live instruction*
- *Parents must notify teachers with at least 24 hour notice to observe in the classroom or a classroom Zoom meeting*
- *Parent involvement opportunities: ELAC, SSC, SGT, Cluster*
- *Website*
- *Weekly parent call out*
- *Access to Power School*

How does the school address this?

The school engages parents and family members to improve the achievement of their children in meaningful interactions with the school.
